To share the love and choice across the masterclasses and 'hands on' sessions, we ask you to only choose the same instructor once for these. There is no limit on the talks/demos. Our booking system will not stop you doing this, but we ask you not to try, as we will have to move you to another which may not have been your second choice!:-)

HANDS-ON SESSION - SOLDERING WITH SILVER CLAY

Understanding when, and knowing how-to solder is a vital technique for jewellery makers. You can expand your jewellery making experience substantially by learning how to solder silver clay.

In this session Anna will teach you:

- •What the soldering process is and how to do it successfully
- · How to make suitable silver clay pieces ready for soldering
- How to sweat solder stud earrings and cufflink backs to your silver clay work
- How to clean up fire scale and polish your pieces ready to wear

HANDS-ON SESSION - PLAYING WITH PAPER TYPE

Art Clay Paper is like foldable paper - it is silver clay but in a non-sticky, rubber-like format; great for making silver origami! You will be shown two different techniques and make a woven silver pendant s well as a pair of earrings. You'll learn:

- •How to work with paper clay
- . Weaving and basic folding techniques
- •How to add lump clay for strength
- How to set fireable cubic zirconia stones
- $_{\bullet} \text{How to kiln fire and polish paper clay pieces}$

DEMO/TALK - CREATING BESPOKE FINDINGS (this session includes some hands-on)

Being able to create bespoke findings (earring wires, clasps etc) can take your jewellery making to the next level whether you craft for yourself or sell your work. You will practice shaping earring wires and then will watch a demo and explanation of creating toggle clasps. In this session learn:

- •How to shape earring wires that fit in with the design of your pieces
- How to make two earring wires the same!
- •The secrets to creating a workable toggle clasp for necklaces and bracelets
- How to design your findings to match your piece

DEMO/TALK - HALLMARKING

Do you know when you must get your jewellery work hallmarked? Do you know how and where to do it? How much does it cost?

The legalities and process around hallmarking can be bewildering. As metal clay artists and jewellery makers that want to sell our pieces, we need to know when we must get our work hallmarked. And how to go about it.

Anna has gone through the process and attended an assay office tour so this talk will be a practical guide to hallmarking for the metal clay artist. You'll have the opportunity to ask questions and get clear about hallmarking and next steps for you.

MASTERCLASS - NIGHTSCENE PENDANT

This workshop is packed full of different techniques, featuring a layered night scene - a starry sky with stylised clouds, moon, and a teeny-tiny bird sitting on a branch.

Create wonderful textures, interesting shapes, and learn lots of tricks for working with very small forms in metal clay without breaking them. You'll be amazed at what you can achieve using Anna's master sculpting techniques!

HANDS-ON SESSION - 3D BUTTERFLY

This session will introduce you to the techniques Anna uses to produce her magical, delicately detailed jewellery. You'll learn how to make a three dimensional detailed butterfly in Art Clay Silver, which you can easily incorporate in various future projects, or, fire it and use it as it is. You will work with tiny, hand created templates, make interesting textures on butterfly wings using really basic tools, construct a butterfly which is not flat, and add exciting textures using paste.

As this is a short session, we will not be firing the piece in the session. Bring a box to safely transport your piece, or leave it with us to be fired and picked up on Sunday.

DEMO/TALK - VINTAJ PATINA

In this talk Anna will show her favourite colouring product, Vintaj Patinas. Anna will show you how these can be used to give fantastic permanent enamelled effects on all sorts of metal clay types.

Vintaj Patinas are opaque inks specially formulated to adhere to metal. They create beautiful and durable patina effects, and easily clean up with water. The Patinas will color silver, brass, copper, and most other metals beautifully. The Patinas can be blended and layered to create endless patina effects.

MASTERCLASS - MARINE MAMMAL

Take a closer look at some marine mammals, and then choose the creature you would like to work on from a series of Carol Douglas pre-made blanks. You will then learn some hand building and sculpting techniques to bring features and character to your pieces. After that you will flesh out your mammal using slip painting techniques.

You will be given hints and tips on using your old dried up bits of clay, paste and sanding dust and scraps to create beautiful lifelike effects. Included in your day will be firing and re-firing schedules to aid working on pre-fired clay and many other sculpting and carving techniques and ideas Carol uses in her production.

HANDS-ON SESSION - CERAMICS AND SILVER CLAY

This class will introduce the possibilities of combining silver metal clay with ceramics and glass. Carol will discuss the use of lump clay as well as syringe and different paste types. Firing schedules and pitfalls will be mentioned and explored. Carol has spent many years teaching ceramics and will show a wide variety of examples of her pieces and experiments in mixing these mediums.

There will be a hands on component of the class were participants can try out some of Carol's techniques using paste and clay on a glazed porcelain blank. **The photo is NOT representative of what you'll be making. It is showing an example of how silver and ceramics can be combined.**

DEMO/TALK - BASE METAL SECRETS

Do you love the stunning colours and extra strength you can get with base metals? Have you been unsure about trying them as the firing seems so complicated? Then this session is for you. Carol will outline the properties and potential of the three main base metals clays; copper, bronze and iron. She will show examples of work produced by herself and some of her friends using a variety of different makes and types of clay.

Carol will give a brief outline of the short history of these clays and indicate why some people may still be finding difficulties in firing and sintering them. Carol will suggest ways that may be tried to improve firing success and construction techniques.

HANDS-ON SESSION - MAKE YOUR OWN STAMP USING PHOTOPOLYMER

One of the most popular techniques with metal clay is adding texture or images using stamps. With the help of photo polymer plates and sachets you can make <u>your own personal</u> stamp from drawings, hand writing or doodles, hand/foot prints, or computer designs.

Grainne will be talking you through each step and showing lots of examples. She will run through everything you need to get started with the technique. You'll get her tips on how to make sure you get great looking clear stamps every time, as well as some pointers on trouble shooting.

DEMO/TALK - USING RING MAKING MOULDS

We all love rings, but sometimes struggle with making them consistently shaped and sized. Here Grainne will show you how to use ring making moulds to create professional looking consistently sized ring bases, which you can then evolve further with decorations and additions.

Grainne will be demonstrating and talking you through each step and showing lots of examples and design ideas along the way, and will be giving lots of useful hints and tips on how to achieve the best possible results.

DEMO/TALK - USING BEAD BUILDER MOULDS

In this demo I'll be showing how to form beautiful beads from metal clay using a variety of easy to use bead builders. These fabulous little moulds help to form professional looking beads in a wonderful variety of shapes and sizes. The beads can be added to necklaces and bracelets or used as focal points in your jewellery creations. Once the basic beads have been formed and dried, they can then be carved or embellished as you choose, to give each one a truly unique look.

I will be demonstrating and talking you through each step and showing lots of examples and design ideas along the way. Once you have seen how the bead builders work you will definitely want to try them for yourself!

MASTERCLASS - CHAIN SAMPLER

Some metal clay experience useful.

Nothing enhances a lovely pendant more than a handmade chain to complement it. Chain making is fun, but can require a bit of patience! On this one day workshop we will explore a variety of techniques for making chains.

We'll make links using silver wire, Art Clay Silver, and a combination of the two. Why is this a 'sampler' workshop? Because you'll make a whole selection of different links so you go away armed with the techniques to inspire you to create your very own unique chains.

From working with metal clay and soldering wire to bashing things with a hammer, this will be a fun and varied day.

HANDS-ON SESSION - STERLING SILVER RINGS

Rings are one of the most popular items of jewellery, but can also be one of the most challenging to make to start with. Getting the sizing right and making sure the design is good and strong are two of the main issues.

In this workshop you will make your own decorated flat band ring using Art Clay Silver 950 Sterling. You'll learn a great method for joining the ring securely and how to achieve a lovely smooth comfort fit inside the ring. We'll also cover other methods for making rings so you go away with lots of ideas to get creating. If time allows there might be an opportunity to set a stone. **Rings will be fired after the class and will be ready for collection in the afternoon**

DEMO/TALK - FINISHING

Have you ever noticed how when a customer picks up a piece of your jewellery to look at it one of the first things they do is turn it over? When the back of your work is finished to the same standard as the front, people will be surprised and delighted to find something 'secret' about the piece, and that always brings a smile too! Backs can sometimes be more of an afterthought, but are just as important as the front. Get creative with bails, set stones, add decorative touches, make the whole of your piece really special.

In this demonstration and presentation Joy will go through different types of bails you can use, ideas for finishing your pieces, how to get a super smooth tactile feel, setting stones and much more. Learn how to give your work the finish it deserves.

MASTERCLASS AND HANDS-ON SESSION - ADDING COLOUR TO METAL

In this workshop, award winning artist, writer and teacher Julia Rai will introduce you to a wide range of ways to colour your metal work. All the colouring techniques can be used on metal clay, silver or polymer clay creations. She will talk about various methods of adding colour to your work, and there will be a wide range of samples for you to see.

No silver clay pieces will be made during the workshop but you can bring your own creations to add colour to, and Julia will go through the best options for these during the day. Polymer clay creations can also be brought in for experimentation. (Please note, some of these colouring methods take up to 72 hours to dry completely so be prepared to leave your pieces in the classroom to dry or bring a tray with sides to take them back to your room.) This is an experimental workshop, so come along with a sense of adventure and curiosity!

DEMO/TALK - TEAR-AWAY TECHNIQUE

The tear away technique was originally taught by Gail Gibson who is a polymer artist. It has been developed by Celie Fago and is particularly useful for texturing on metal clay which you intend to Keum Boo. The relief of the textures obtained from using tear away is low and gentle which makes it ideal for Keum Boo.

This is also a very easy way of creating your own unique textures.

Julia will have lots of samples of textures made using this technique. She will demonstrate the technique and give you all the tips and hints to ensure your textures are successful every time. A handout will also be given out so you can go home and begin creating your own textures straight away.

DEMO/TALK - BUILDING A WEBSITE AND USING SOCIAL MEDIA

A website is a fantastic way to promote your work, find new customers, and give your business credibility. A social media presence is an important tools for many artists, but how do you do it, and where should you be seen? Kim will cover topics like design, what information to include, hot to integrate your website with social media, making social media an extension of your art, and how to keep up the momentum. Current website and social media profile examples will be part of the discussion.

HANDS-ON SESSION - MAGIC MOULDS

If you spot Leigh away from her studio, there is a very big chance you'll find moulding compound in her bag. She follows the good old metal clay motto of "If it stands still long enough, mould it!"

Leigh will show you how to create successful moulds that can be used over & over again. Try several different moulding compounds to see which suits you best. Learn the tricks of the trade to guarantee crisp, intricate imprints every single time. Leigh will show you how to create your own tools for your signature style, in addition she will be providing a number of items on the day from her own studio for you to mould so that you will go home with a stash of new moulds for your kit. In addition Leigh will be teaching you how to do two-part moulds which will enable you to create three-dimensional forms. You'll finish the session by making a fine silver replica of one of your moulds!

DEMO/TALK - MOULD MAKING DEMO

In this session Leigh runs through her top 10 tools, why she loves them, and how she uses them.

In this session Petra will run though different techniques of how to add real gold to your silver, discussing some of the options available and their individual benefits. She'll run through how to choose the best materials, and what tools and equipment you need, as well as how to avoid some common pitfalls. Petra will demonstrate Keum-Boo, a ancient Korean technique, which was introduced to the metal clay world by Celie Fago.

DEMO/TALK - CONNECTIONS AND COMPLETIONS

When you design you need to think about how your piece will look as well as function as a finished piece of jewellery. How will it hang? What length should it be? What clasp will you use? To create a piece the really works, you need to make any possible fastenings, findings, and beads, a part of your design rather than just a functional afterthought. What to do with your finished pendant or charm to make it into a unique finished piece of jewellery. After 4 years as a Senior Product Designer for one of the US' premier wholesalers of jewellery making supplies Shayna has lots of experience to call on. In this session Shayna will talk about, and show you, how to finish your jewellery using beads, cords and clasps. She'll show how to string beads and use crimp beads/tubes, as well as how to create standard and wrapped loops.

MASTERCLASS - NEW MOKUME GANE

Mokume-gane is is a traditional Japanese technique dating back thousands of years. It roughly translates into "wood grain metal", which describes the beautiful layered effect very well. The traditional technique is incredibly labour intensive, which makes it very expensive to produce. Thanks to the wonders of metal clay, this technique has been brought back to life in the new contemporary, and simpler way. Hello NEW Mokume Gane! During this master class Tracey will share her tips and techniques, and teach you how to layer silver and copper clay to create different pattern combinations, as well as how to fire this combination of two different types of clays successfully. You can make a few pairs of earrings to test out the different pattern techniques, or one statement pendant. **Please note; due to the long firing schedule the pieces will be fired over night, and will be ready for you to collect the next day to polish and finish.**

HANDS-ON SESSION - FUCHSIA EARRINGS

The new Art Clay Paper type is a curious form of the medium that has many applications for its use. It behaves quite differently from lump metal clay. Straight from the packet it has a dry, almost fabric-like quality, with a fragility that needs sympathy to understand its limitations. Equally it has many applications and there are many benefits of working with this material.

Spend the morning exploring the possibilities of paper type and make these pretty flower earrings. We warn you - this can be addictive. As Tracey will also demonstrate many other techniques, you'll leave armed with techniques and ideas to try out at home!

HANDS-ON SESSION - EFCO COLOURING

Come and play with colours for a few hours and leave wearing your personal enamelled pendant! "Traditional" enamels (vitreous enamels) require the high temperatures of a kiln or torch. Efcolor, however, is a cold enamel which means it can be baked in your kitchen oven or a tea light stove.

In this session you will play around with colours, and learn how to create fades and effects, how to prepare your blank, and how to use stencils for patterns. You'll also be shown how to add decorations and what materials are suitable to use with Efcolor.
